## From your 1st Vice District Governor

### How to Speak Lionese or Lion's Alphabet Soup

Ever see this in a District, State, or International news item?

“Lions gathered for a state convention. Present from 17-I were ZC Peter, 1<sup>st</sup> VDG Marion, 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG Bill, DG Marilyn, PDG Tom, CC Bill, PCC Bryce, ID Anne, PID Ernie, and the IP Sid and PIP Bill. They discussed the MERL team and MJFs while L.S.M.F.T.” Did you just go, “Huh?”

Every company or organization

uses abbreviations. Lions show respect for positions at the district level and above by using the individual title to show respect for the position and the individual in that position of leadership.

Here is a short course in what the abbreviations mean: ZC=Zone Chair. This is the first level of responsibility above the club level. In our District 17-I zone chairs are responsible for being the go between district leadership and the clubs. Most zone chairs in our district have 5 or so Lions clubs to visit, listen to

members, and report what is going on in our district and pass on to clubs what is happening at district, state, and international levels of Lions. 1<sup>st</sup> VDG & 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG: We now have a first and second vice district governor. This allows for 2 years of training and experience for folks to get ready for the most important office that I know of in Lions: DG=District Governor.

We have 5 districts in Kansas: 17-L, 17-I, 17-O, 17-N, & 17-S. Each District Governor is responsible for about 60 clubs in their district,

He/She has undergone extensive training to lead our district. PDG= Past District Governor. District Governors only serve a 1 year term. That keeps Lions from being a private kingdom of an individual. Past Governors are still interested in helping, and you will see many of them at Lions meetings everywhere.

CC=Council Chair. Kansas state Lions headquarters is in Wichita. The state Council Chair is similar to the President of the state Lions. Many are past District Governors that assume head of all Kansas Lions. PCC=Past Council Chair. One who has been Council Chair and is still helping Lions. ID=International Director. Lions Clubs International is governed by a board of directors which are elected at the annual convention for a 2 year term. Kansas is

honored to have ID Anne Smarsh on the current board.

PID=Past International Director. Lion Emie is probably the most recognized since he makes a bunch of visits to Lions activities. IP=International President. This position also changes every year. They choose a theme for their year in charge of the largest service organization. Current IP Scruggs theme is, "Lions, A Beacon of Hope". PIP: Past International President. PIP Bill Wunder from southern Kansas will show up at a lot of Kansas Lions meetings. MERL team: Membership, Extension, Retention, & Leadership. This group covers 4 areas for Lions to keep going and growing. It is currently being replaced by a new form of help for Lions.

MJF=Melvin Jones Fellow. Melvin Jones was the founder of Lions. In his memory, any Lion can be awarded this top honor for a donation of \$1,000. For ways to help nominate a fellow Lion to receive this honor, consult with your District leadership. L.S.M.F.T.=only really old folks will recognize this. Has nothing to do with Lions. :)

I Hope this has been of some help to our members. Don't forget, if you are the President or Secretary of a Lions club, you should attend the District cabinet meeting in Abilene. Your club needs you; you deserve to be the best at your very important club job. See elsewhere for meeting details. Mark your calendar for August 21<sup>st</sup>.

## **Your help is needed**

There is a young boy ( he will be in the second grade) that has an eye problem. He has severe headaches after reading. His reading progress has been slow with difficulty in decoding. There is a diagnosis of migraines for which he takes aspirin therapy daily.

The treatment for the problem is medically necessary and is referred to as orthoptic therapy. This treatment is specific for the neuromuscular anomaly and is being done to correct the conditions and is not connected in any way with routine eye care, refractive error, or eyeglasses. **The proposed therapy plan would require approximately 12-20 visits at \$75.00 per visit.**

The goal is to improve his visual efficiency by improving his focusing, tracking, and visual processing skills. Vision therapy utilizes various activities with lenses and prisms to remediate delays in the visual skills

The family has hardship issues. They went trough a tornado several years ago in which they lost everything.
