From your District Governor DG Marion's Musings

International convention: We tend to think of Lions through the lens of our local club. The 94th annual Lions Clubs International convention was held in Seattle, Washington in early July. Somewhere between 12 & 16,000 Lions attended from over 100 countries. Lions had the largest parade that Seattle had seen in over 40 years. Seeing a big arena full of Lions brought home the forgotten point that we truly are the largest international service organization.

We learned that Lions partnered with the Bill & Melinda Gates charitable foundation in Africa. Over 17 million African children were inoculated to keep them from getting measles. A direct result of that program was that measles deaths in children dropped from 450,000 to just over 200,000. Many of us don't remember that measles used to be a killer of children here in the USA. Lions Foundation provided lots of funds for disaster relief in Japan, New Zealand, Southeastern USA, and even Reading, Kansas.

Dr. Wing-kun Tam is the new International President from Hong Kong. He has designated goals for all Lions in quarterly units. The first 3 months are for getting youth projects and Leos going. dhking@bluevalley.net President Tam wants all worldwide Lions clubs to plant as many trees as each club has members.

That would mean about 1,250 trees should be planted in our district in the next year. Is your club up to planting as many trees as you have members???

Kansas Lions: There were Kansans in the Seattle parade, and several bystanders wondered where we got the great sunflower umbrellas we used in the parade.

Kansas Lions are also sponsoring the Mobile Screening Unit again this year at the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson. Dates are September 9-18. We need lots of volunteers to staff the MSU, including EMTs, LPNs, or RNs for diabetes checks. If you would like a free pass and free parking, you should volunteer for several hours. The MSU should have a brand new Pediavision sight screener installed by fair time. This Pediavision is a separate unit from the one that our district is close to getting. Pediavision in the MSU will be a big bonus for the unit as children from 6 months up will likely have their first vision test. We Lions, through the Pediavision screener in the MSU, could literally save the sight for hundreds of children here in Kansas.

That is an outstanding achievement for all Kansas Lions!

The first State Council meeting of Kansas Lions will be held at Great Bend, August 12-14. We will learn what the Kansas State Council has planned for Kansas Lions in the coming year.

District 17-I Lions: Most of our clubs take a summer break from activities and meetings. We think that our district Lions are not doing much. How wrong we are! Lions-Quest

Lions Quest is the hope of every nation for our children. As educators, parents/grandparents, and active community members, we have an opportunity to touch the lives of young people everyday. Working together, we can guide young people in becoming capable, contributing citizens. We can make a real difference. Through caring, understanding, guidance, and teaching, we affect the future.

How do we encourage our children to strive to be the best they can be? We need to teach them more than the capitols of the world and the computation of numbers. We must also help them develop respect for themselves and others and help them form strong commitments to family, positive peers, school, community and the world beyond.

Our children need the self-confidence that comes from developing and building on their strengths. They also need the insight to handle their emotions constructively, the ability to set positive goals, and the

knowledge and skills needed for a safe and healthy approach to life, free from the harm of drug abuse and alcohol. Lions Quest is a leading program throughout the world. Since 1984, Lions have sponsored Lions Quest programs for local schools to teach life skills to our youth. Lions Quest is now implemented in more than 60 countries and adapted to 30 languages. Nearly 12 million youth have benefited from Lions Quest. Statistics show that many are now graduating with a bright future to look forward to.

The year I was a District Governor I attended a full-day Lions Quest workshop (one of the two days required of the teachers) – sat in on trainings and helped with the snacks and food for the teachers. In the evening I attended a school board meeting with LCI's trainer and our two Lions that she was training. It was a very knowledgeable day.

Lions, we have the ability to choose the Lions Quest program to be implemented in our schools for

our children. At this time I am working with the State Lions Quest Chair to learn if our second grant application for the State of Kansas Lions was received from LCI – the possibility of our district writing a grant – the amount of money needed to purchase the supplies for the teachers and for the training workshop.

The Lions Quest training in our schools must be accepted by the School Board and the teachers must be willing participate. It also requires money to start and continue this program in the schools. As soon as all the required information I need is attained I will then move forward.

What I require from our Lions is to email or mail to me the name of their school and the principal's name and phone number. I will record the list and I will contact the school when everything is in place.
